

MAINTENANCE WORKER II

DEFINITION

Under direction, to supervise a small crew and participate in the maintenance and repair of City streets, sanitary sewers and storm drains, park and recreation landscaped areas, and other public works; to do related work as required.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTION REQUIREMENTS

Ability to drive and possess a valid California driver's license; knowledge of common tools, materials and practices used in construction, gardening and maintenance work; ability to operate trucks, motorized equipment and hand tools; mechanical aptitude; ability to follow written and oral instructions; physical strength, agility, endurance, and the ability to do heavy lifting; ability to perform work that is labor intensive and which requires heavy lifting; there is considerable bending and stooping required; ability to lay out and supervise work of a small crew.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Supervises a small crew and participates in the construction, maintenance and repair of streets, curbs, gutters, sewers, storm drains, catch basins, barricades, sidewalks, parks, landscaped areas, and recreation equipment and facilities; operates and makes minor repairs and adjustments to heavy power-driven equipment; constructs forms for and does cement work; does occasional brick work and building construction and maintenance work; builds retaining walls; supervises and performs slide control planting, creek bed clean out, park landscape planting and maintenance, including irrigation; athletic field maintenance; use of herbicides.

EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS

Any combination of education and experience equivalent to graduation from high school and three years of progressively responsible public works construction, gardening and maintenance work; ability to perform a variety of semi-skilled construction, gardening and repair tasks; ability to operate heavy motorized equipment and power tools; ability to lay out and supervise work; ability to read landscape, sprinkler and play equipment plans; ability to maintain time and material records; physical strength, agility and endurance.

LICENSE

Ability to drive and possess a valid Class B California driver's license. May be required to qualify for an obtain a Class "A" or Class "B" driver's license and therefore be subject to random drug and alcohol testing under Department of Transportation regulations.
